CATS Testing-May 10-21

What is C.A.T.S. and Why is it Important?

C.A.T.S. stand for the Commonwealth Accountability Testing System which is the standards-based test given to all Kentucky school children. It is given for the purpose of determining to what extent our students are learning the Core Content-the essential components of Instruction. Specific content areas are assessed at various grade levels throughout the child's school career. The results of this test are used to measure the overall performance of a school based upon the goal of continuous and steady improvement from year to year by ALL students in ALL areas.

What can parents do to help?

Encourage our child to take this test seriously and do his/her best work. Encourage your child to attend school every day during test week. Encourage your child to get a good night's rest each night before a test. Encourage your child to eat something each morning before they come to school. Schedule all doctor and dentist appointments after school or at a time that will not conflict with testing. Encourage your child to keep up with the work in all of his/her classes.
