Boys & Girls Clubs (Black Mountain and Cumberland)

Giving children the hope and opportunity they need to succeed.

- · After school daycare
- Academic enrichment
- Bus students home in evenings



Educational Talent Search (HCHS only)

Help prepare students for college admissions, financing and support opportunities.

- Provide ACT prep workshops
- Provide funding for ACT exams
- Offer educational field trips, including college/university visits
- Assist with FAFSA application, college enrollment assistance and scholarships



Family Healthcare (All Schools)

Provide basic medical needs to all students and staff.

- · Give daily medications
- Provide first aid and emergency care
- Lead of the Cardiac Emergency Response Team (CERT)
- Provide school and sports physicals
- May provide treatment to students and staff with signed consent
- Vaccinations to students and staff



Family Resource & Youth Service Centers (All Schools)

Address all non-academic barriers to education.

- · Provide dental and vision services with signed consent
- Identify and schedule service providers for mental health screening/counseling services
- Home visits for truancy and attendance
- Provide food and clothing for at risk students
- Provides personal hygiene items and school supplies
- Sponsor programs and activities throughout the year for students
- Point of contact for charitable programs



Full Service Community Grant (All Schools)

Address in and out of school barriers, learning before and after school and on weekends and summer.

- Expanded and enriched learning time
- Active family and community support
- Integrated student supports



GEAR UP (All Schools)

Transitioning students to and through postsecondary.

- ⇒ Academic Interventionists (HCHS and Evarts)
- Provides tutoring and enrichment activities
- Provides ACT prep to students
- Coordinate and administer Mastery Prep
- Conduct home visits



- ⇒ College and Career Navigators (All Schools)
- Provides KEES information to students and families during family engagement activities
- Implement summer STEM camps
- Organize college visits
- Complete Individual Learning Plans (ILP) with students using career cruising

Gifted and Talented (All Schools)

Assure students with gifts and talents have access and opportunities to accelerated services.

- Provide two (2) enrichment opportunities each year
- Ensures teachers and parents are provided gifted student service plans
- Administer assessments to identify potential gifted students
- Conduct progress monitoring two (2) times per year



McKinney-Vento Homeless Grant (All Schools)

Assisting homeless students with securing resources.

- Participate in home visits and serve as a member of the truancy team
- Collect, load and retrieve data pertinent to "at-risk" students who are homeless.
- Facilitate and collaborate with outside resource agencies, school administrators, teachers and peers
- Serve as a resource to all school personnel on homeless laws
- Provide support activities for students and their families
- Serves as a liaison between schools, shelters and the community on behalf of homeless/mobile students.

Mental Health Counselors (All Schools)

Board approved providers include: MCHC, Comprehensive Care, Second Mile Behavioral, H&A Counseling.

- Provide mental health support opportunities through counseling
- Provide crisis intervention support programs



McKinney-Vento

Police Department/SRO (All Schools)

Provide daily protection for students and staff.

- Enforce state statutes
- · Protection of life and property
- Suppression of criminal activity, apprehension of offenders
- Regulation of non-criminal conduct
- Enforcement of traffic and parking regulations
- Conduct investigations on campus only



Save the Children (All Elementary Schools) - Coordinators and Mentors

Ensuring every child has the opportunity to learn.

- Administer the Renaissance Star Ready and Math Tests
- Work with students in small reading groups
- Work with students on phonemic awareness
- Facilitate/assist students with Accelerated Reader daily



UNITE AMERICORPS (JACES, Cumberland and Evarts)

Provides math tutoring and drug prevention education to elementary.

- Uses 'Too Good for Drugs" curricula
- Sponsors anti-drug clubs
- Recruit volunteers for school-based prevention programs
- Serves as summer intern
- Works to decrease a youth's intention to use alcohol or drugs, while developing social and emotional skills for healthy choices, building positive friendships, developing self-efficacy, communicating effectively, and resisting peer pressure and influence
